- **Keep a flexible approach towards them**
 - **Encourage them to be independent**
 - **Be inclusive, appreciate their differences and enjoy their diversity**
 - **Offer your help when needed and provide immediate positive reinforcement when they produce a correct response.**
- **If they make a mistake, do not say, “that’s wrong.” Instead, ask him or her to try again**
 - **Support don’t judge**
- **Different mindset is their strongest asset**
 - **Promote language development**
 - **Reinforce positive behaviour**
